LAND BOUNCES BACK IN OWG 13.

After a rough conclusion of the OWG 12, with land disappearing in many of the goals, OWG13 raises a lot of hope for its inclusion in the final SDGs that will be passed by the 69^{th} session of the General Assembly to be held later this year.

Below is an analysis of the paragraphs on land, comparing OWG12 and OWG13.
