Land underpins the New Urban Agenda as land is a key driver for urban development!



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












# ACTIONS UNDER COMMITMENT 2 <u>SUSTAINABLE LAND USE</u> TO BE INCLUDED IN THE NEW URBAN AGENDA

Action 4: Ensure that (spatial) urban planning results in efficient, socially, culturally and environmentally sustainable use of land in spite of high and rapid population growth. To this end, establish effective land management, including transparent, inclusive, equitable and non-discriminatory, participatory land use planning, land readjustment and land sharing and its effective implementation resulting in low rates of land consumption.



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# ACTIONS UNDER COMMITMENT 2 SUSTAINABLE LAND USE

#### TO BE INCLUDED IN THE NEW URBAN AGENDA


Action 5: Promote balanced territorial development and support secondary cities through national and regional spatial planning. Action 6: Promote spatial planning for city regions and encourage inter-

Action 6: Promote spatial planning for city regions and encourage intermunicipal cooperation.

Action 7: Fulfil the social function of land, respecting diversity in its widest sence, ensuring equitable access for all to safe public space, infrastructure and services, responding to the needs of all, incl. women, children, youth and LGTB, and protecting the cultural landscape.









# ACTIONS UNDER COMMITMENT 4 <u>ENABLING RESPONSIBLE LAND GOVERNANCE</u> TO BE INCLUDED IN THE NEW URBAN AGENDA

Action 11: Eliminate administrative and political corruption, fraud and clientelism in land administration and management through promotion of accountability, transparency and participation of all when handling land.

Action 12: Create short, simple, affordable procedures and standards adjusted to local requirements and ensure customer-friendly delivery-systems that are effective and efficient, accessible and affordable, accountable and transparent exploiting the contribution of digital and communication technologies as well as the wide range of data and information including geospatial information.

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### ACTIONS UNDER COMMITMENT 4 <u>ENABLING RESPONSIBLE LAND GOVERNANCE</u> TO BE INCLUDED IN THE NEW URBAN AGENDA

Action 13: Ensure transparent and responsible public land management to the benefit of all minimizing the risk of misuse.

Action 14: Recognize the crucial role of land in violence, social unrest and conflicts and ensure that measures affecting land use and/or tenure arrangements do not directly result or indirectly trigger conflict, social unrest or violence, including intra-household violence.





### ACTIONS UNDER COMMITMENT 4 <u>ENABLING RESPONSIBLE LAND GOVERNANCE</u> TO BE INCLUDED IN THE NEW URBAN AGENDA

Action 15: Promote the inclusion of long-term perspectives, including long-term needs and interests of the community when dealing with land issues.

Action 16: Establish and implement national land policies, laws and standards in accordance with international law.

Action 17: Establish national standards for land use planning, land valuation, land value capture etc. that respect international human rights law, ensure a pro-poor approach and are adjusted to local conditions ensuring their applicability.

Action 18: Promote participatory approaches and methods such as participatory land use planning, participatory land readjustment, participatory enumeration, crowd sourcing etc.

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# ACTIONS UNDER COMMITMENT 4 <u>ENABLING RESPONSIBLE LAND GOVERNANCE</u> TO BE INCLUDED IN THE NEW URBAN AGENDA

**Commitment 19:** Constantly collect, up-date and analyse **geo-spatial information in a transparent and accessible manner** while taking the necessary safeguards.

**Commitment 20: Be fully committed to and accountable** for the implementation of the New Urban Agenda and monitor and evaluate it regularly in a meaningful way.







# PROPOSED INDICATORS FOR THE FOUR COMMITMENTS

#### **Indicator for Commitment 1:**

<u>Refer to indicator SDG 1.4.</u> on the proportion of women, men, indigenous peoples and local communities with secure tenure rights to individually or communally held land, property and natural resources.

#### Indicator for Commitment 2:

<u>Refer to indicator SDG 11.3.1.</u> on the ratio of land consumption rate to population growth rate.

#### Indicator for Commitment 3:

An indicator could read as follows: share of land based revenue of overall municipal revenue.

#### Indicator for Commitment 4:

Introduce new indicator such as the number of documented illicit land transactions.

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### ASSESSMENT OF NUA ZERO DRAFT: LAND ISSUES INCLUDED, PARTIALLY INCLUDED AND MISSING IN THE DRAFT

#### Awareness raising: Missing

**Providing affordable space**: Partially – only in regard to housing **Ensuring tenure security**: Partially: Issue is dealt with, no reference to VGGT, no reference to the prohibition of forced eviction


**Ensuring sustainable use of land**: Partially; Sections "sustainable consumption", "stakeholder engagement framework" and "urban planning and management" need more specification and stronger wording

**Responsible land governance**: Corruption, fraud and clientelism are not addressed.

**Generating land based finance**: Roughly. The issue is mentioned in half a sentence – but limited to a minor aspect. 1-2 additional sentences needed to ensure that people not familiar with the term "capture" understand the issue and get an idea of what can be done.

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### ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS / ISSUES TO BE INCLUDED IN THE NEW URBAN AGENDA

1. Government as leader/coordinator of different actors.

2. **Encourage all potential actors** to get involved, including civil society, responsible private actors, national, regional and local governments and administrations.

3.Create **opportunities for non-state actors**. Empower civil society. Create strategic partnerships between civil society and private-publicpartnerships ensuring that public monies are used to create public resources and income and that private actors adhere to the UN Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights.

4.When referring to private sector reference to UN Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights should be ensured by using the term "responsible private investor/enterprise/business"

5. Promote local action frameworks prepared by multi-stakeholder groups.
