## **SDG INDICATOR 1.4.2**

Proportion of total adult population with secure tenure rights to land, with (a) legally recognized documentation and (b) who perceive their rights to land as secure, by sex and by type of tenure

## **SDG INDICATOR 5.a.1**

(a) Proportion of total agricultural population with ownership or secure rights over agricultural land by sex; and (b) share of women among owners or rights-bearers of agricultural land, by type of tenure

## Purpose:

Is to introduce and discuss with National Statistical Offices (NSO) the IAEG-SDGs approved methodology for measuring indicators 1.4.2 and 5.a.1; data sources, and the feasibility of its adaption in countries for effective monitoring and reporting on SDGs. The workshop brings together NSO officials responsible for the survey design, management, and reporting on the SDGs including land indicators and representatives of other data contributing agencies, statisticians and supporting partners.

## Learning objectives:

1. Deepen understanding of why land matters to achieve SDGs and how land indicators should be part of national priority monitored by governments and included in National Voluntary Reviews.
2. Increase knowledge of the approved methodology for monitoring SDG indicators 1.4.2 and 5. a.1 and how to integrate into existing and relevant national surveys.
3. Increase the appreciation of National Statistical Organisations on the need to include essential questions in relevant surveys, collect data and report on the two tenure security indicators in the SDGs by 2020.
4. Action plans by participating NSOs on data collection including areas of support required from custodians and other actors to achieve data collection and report on the two indicators.
5. Strengthen synergies and identify initiatives for collaboration among key actors

## Process:

1. Discuss land indicators as priority in SDGs and national voluntary reporting
2. Present and discuss the IAEG-SDG approved methodology for measuring indicators 1.4.2 and 5.a.1 and data sources (survey/admin);
3. Present and discuss list of essential questions/ joint questionnaire module for data collection developed by the custodian agencies; concepts, implications for different survey types; customization, self-reporting;
4. Discuss inventory of surveys by country where questions can be integrated/added, any support required from custodians; practical examples from countries that have adjusted/ integrated
5. Formulation of and agreement on next steps (action plans)

## Participation:

This workshop is designed for technical officers of National Statistical Offices and Organizations (NSOs) responsible for the survey design, management and reporting on the SDGs including land indicators. Representatives of other data contributing agencies, statisticians and supporting partners will also attend the workshop. A total of maximum 40 participants will attend the workshop. ## Preparation:

Participants will receive essential reading material beforehand, and some will need to prepare reference materials on their specific countries land related surveys and data infrastructure as learning and exchange materials.
