



## Background and Objective

UN-Habitat recently published the report 'Addressing Land Administration and Land Rights Challenges to Pave the Ground for Peace and Stability in Libya'. Developed in consultation with a wide range of Libyan stakeholders and validated in a Roundtable organized in Tripoli in 2022, the report highlights the key features, challenges and priorities for reform of the land sector to respond to the needs of modern Libya.

The event will present some of the highlights from the analysis and provide the opportunity to have a discussion on some of the recommendations.

The session will be a panel discussion on the findings and recommendations of the Land Administration in Libya. The participants will have improved awareness about the land rights and land administration in Libya as well as increased convergence on key land-related priorities that support peace, stability, and socio-economic recovery.
