### **ORGANIZATION PROFILE**

Barangay Bacusanon is about 91.3 kilometers away from Cagayan de Oro City with an approximate one hour and 55 minutes travel time. The indigenous peoples organization (IPO) in this barangay is called Nagkahiusang Manobong Manununod sa Yutang Kabilin (NAMAMAYUK) that covers Sitio Bugwak and Balmar of Barangay Nabaliwa, Sitio San Guinto and Megbadiang of Bacusanon. It has 208 households.

The group was able to formulate their ancestral domain sustainable development and protection




plan (ADSDPP) with support from Xavier Science Foundation, Inc. (XSF) in 2016. Currently, they are evaluating their ADSDPP for submission to National Commission on Indigenous Peoples (NCIP). NAMAMAYUK had to re-organize their group to implement their plans.

## **MUNICIPALITY OF PANGANTUCAN**

Pangantucan is a first class municipality with a population of 53,126 people (2015 census). Formerly a *barrio* of Maramag, Pangantucan has been granted municipal status in 1961. It is located approximately 75 kilometers south of Malaybalay City and about 166 kilometers from Cagayan de Oro City. The municipality is bounded on the southwest side by the province of Lanao del Sur, and the province of North Cotabato on the southern part. It has a land area of 46,172 hectares and composed of 19 barangays.



This project is implemented by the Asian NGO Coalition for Agrarian Reform and Rural Development (ANGOC) in partnership with Xavier Science Foundation, Inc. (XSF), with technical and financial support from Global Land Tool Network (GLTN) and Germany's Federal Ministry of Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ).

This Project shall enhance the tenurial security of about 2,500 households of indigenous peoples in two municipalities in Bukidnon, Northern Mindanao. It has three (3) targeted outcomes:

- a) increased uptake of land tools, approaches, frameworks and policy guidelines that are pro-poor, fit-forpurpose, and gender responsive;
- b) strengthened capacity of change agents and rural poor women, men and vulnerable groups to implement pro-poor, fit-for-purpose and gender responsive land tools and approaches; and,
- c) improved awareness among stakeholders on issues and measures for improving land and natural resource tenure security for poor women, men and vulnerable groups.
