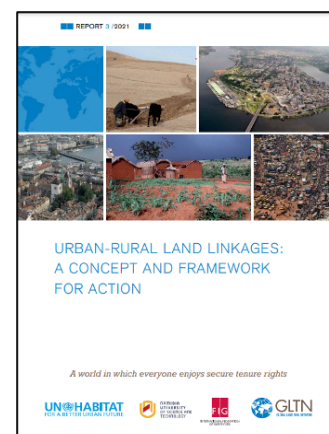
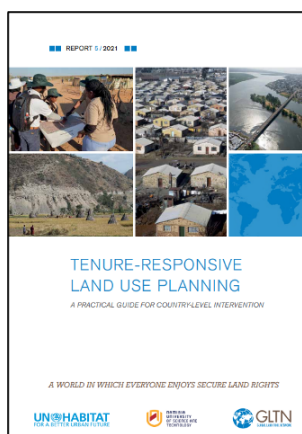

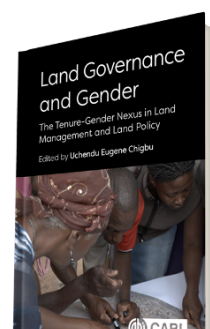

3.3. Breakout Session 10 promoting Good Governance and Land administration

The Malay Reserve land (MRL) was first introduced in 1914 as the Malay Reservation Land Enactment and later revised as the Malay Reservation Enactment in 1935 by the British colonialists. The two main objectives of the Malay Reservation Land Law are to preserve and protect Malay land ownership from being transferred to the immigrant communities during the British Malaya period. The protection mechanism is by way of:

- prevent the State Authorities from disposing Malay Reservation land to non-Malays, and to
- prevent any private dealings between Malays and non-Malays in term of Malay Holdings or Malay Reservation Land.

The MRL can only be owned by a Malay and cannot be transferred, sold, leased, or dealt with in any manner whatsoever with non-Malays. Reason being to protect the Malay land rights. Most of the land except for some are situated within rural areas and require huge investment for industrial or commercial development. The land administrators are promoting the land to be developed for agricultural activities since this land are categorised as agricultural in order to ensure food security for the nation. The Malaysian government in the Budget 2022 and 12th Malaysian Plan have given prominence to the development of agricultural land, idle land as well as reserved land with a handsome allocation of Ringgit Malaysia 4.2 billion.

Emerging Research to be shared

The session will provide insights of the roles of the land administrator in Redeveloping Malay Reserved Land in Malaysia and the proposed strategic plan based on the prevailing policy, legal and administrative framework, and financial implications.

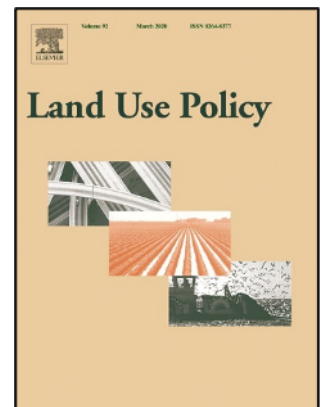
