## Rational and context


This workshop is in support of the Global Land Tool Network (GLTN) Phase 3 Programme, within the Land, Housing and Shelter Section of UN-Habitat. The project is linked to the work of the International Professional Bodies Cluster, co-chaired by the FIG and the Arab Union of Surveyors. Furthermore, this workshop builds on the Arab Land Initiative, which envisions that people in the Arab countries will enjoy equitable and affordable access to land, peace, stability and economic growth by working together on good land policies and transparent, efficient and affordable land administration systems.

The workshop in Tunisia will contribute to raising awareness and promoting the use of Fit-For-Purpose land administration (FFPLA) tools and approaches in the Arab region. Through these approaches and tools the GLTN community aims to work towards the common goal of improved access to land and tenure security.





The three-day workshop on the Application of Fit-For-Purpose Land Administration in the Arab Region will explore and showcase various country examples and developments in legislation, governance, hardware, software, and processing solutions that support FFPLA.





- Understandings and awareness of the tenure security challenges in the Arab Region, and the principles and aspects of the application of FFPLA
- Testing with industry partners and outputs resulting from the application of the FFP LA tools, techniques and procedures
- Ability to analyse and select appropriate FFPLA techniques and tools within a given context
- Knowledge on how to apply the tools and approaches within specific home institutions and respective countries
- Broader appreciation of the governance, legal, and institutional issues association with scaled FFPLA application
